

Wesleyan Christmas Cards

Attention: Middle and High School Students

This year, once again, we are extending the Christmas card program into the middle and upper schools on a voluntary basis, allowing interested students to create their own artwork. Students and their families are under no obligation to purchase the card. We want anyone with the energy, talent, or interest to create the artwork for a Christmas card to do so. Students enrolled in an art class for the first semester will be completing a design in their respective art classes. Requirements for the cards are as follows:

Students must:

1. Use an 8-1/2 x 11 piece of paper – something heavier than typing paper is best.
2. Create work horizontally or vertically – your choice.
3. Use any medium. Those that have worked best in the past are paint, markers, or collage. Remember that brighter colors will reproduce better. The middle and high school art teachers are happy to have students work in the art rooms during back work over the next three weeks and have offered not only their art expertise, but the use of the school's materials for this project.
4. The inside greeting on all the Wesleyan cards will be the same. *"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs." Psalm 100:1-2.*
5. DEADLINE for submitting artwork is Monday, September 27, 2010. Artwork must be submitted to one of the art teachers in the middle or high school. PLEASE CLEARLY LABEL FIRST AND LAST NAME AND GRADE ON THE BACK OF THE ARTWORK.
6. Previously created artwork may be submitted, but please do not use anything which has already been entered into any competition or contest, as that work may be proprietary.

There will be a \$25 VISA gift card issued to the student chosen for overall artistic excellence on this project. HAVE FUN!
